



Lesson 2: You're Welcome!

LESSON NOTES

In today's lesson, we will continue to learn more phrases that will help you with basic etiquette. Poles are very hospitable. They use phrases of gratitude quite often. Even though you may not get the chance to use "Proszę" (the phrase for "You're welcome") during your trip in Poland, there's a very good chance you will hear it. So let's have a closer look at it!

In Polish, "You're welcome" is "Proszę."

You can also respond to someone that has thanked you by using two very similar expressions. They are "Nie ma za co," which means "Not at all" and "Drobiazg," which means "It's nothing."

We can use any of these expressions, "Proszę, Nie ma za co," and "Drobiazg," in any situation, formal or informal.

PHRASES

Polish	English
Proszę.	You're welcome.
Nie ma za co.	Not at all.
Drobiazg.	It's nothing.

QUICK TIP

The word "Proszę" has many meanings and we can use it in many different situations. We have looked at one of them today. When you want to say, "you're welcome," you can use "Proszę" as a set phrase after "Dziękuję". We will explain the other meanings of "Proszę" in the next chapter.
